W. Christopher Lenhardt is a research staff member and Director of the ORNL Distributed Active Archive Center (DAAC). Lenhardt received an MS in international relations from The London School of Economics and Political Science in 1986. In 1990, he received an MS in political science from The University of Michigan. Between obtaining his master's degrees, Lenhardt studied French language at the Université de Bourgogne, in Dijon, France.

As a member of the Environmental Data Science and Systems Group, Lenhardt also holds the title of deputy manager of the ORNL DAAC for Biogeochemical Dynamics—a National Aeronautics and Atmospheric Administration (NASA)-funded data center that is part of NASA's Earth Observing System. For fiscal year 2010, Lenhardt is the principal investigator (PI) for the Laboratory Directed Research and Development Program-sponsored "Enhancing Climate Impact Integrated Assessment for Water through Climate Informatics" project and also the co-PI for the "Scale Dependency in Dynamic Downscaling of Extreme Climate Events over Complex Topography" project.

In addition to his roles at ORNL, Lenhardt serves as vice president of the Earth Science Information Partners Federation. He is also co-chair for the International Council for Science: Committee for Data for Science and Technology Task Group on Preservation of and Access to Scientific and Technical Data in Developing Countries, and a board member for the Foundation for Earth Science.
